Welcome to the International Political Science Association's 23rd World Congress in Montreal. The theme of this year's event is "Challenges of Contemporary Governance." We live in a time of great challenges, and it is paramount that political scientists contribute to debates on issues of governance. By staging its World Congress, IPSA hopes to foster a global conversation that advances our knowledge of these and other issues. We are pleased to have you among us.

Challenges to governance arise, in many cases, from within. Since the mid-1970s, many countries have moved from autocracy to democracy; more

recently, however, this move toward greater democracy has been stalled and in some cases reversed. The financial crisis of 2008 dealt a difficult blow to many countries. For countries in East, Central and Southern Europe, economic and political problems have gone hand in hand. Political science has helped us understand the forces driving the push for more democracy and the institutions that form the bedrock of mature democracies. But research on corrosive forces undermining democracy and entrenching autocracy is equally important.

Democracy has faced strong challenges in some regions. The Arab Spring seemed to signal a shift toward democracy in a region with a long history of autocratic rule. Steps to achieve democracy have been slow and hesitant, however. In sub-Saharan Africa, the advent of multi-party elections in many countries was heralded years ago; now the question is whether free and fair elections can bring about greater democracy. Democracy came earlier to Latin America, but crime and narco-trafficking remain serious problems. Asia presents a mixed portrait. The China model, for instance, is one of rapid economic growth coupled with strong autocracy. Political science research has helped to identify the specificities of individual countries and regions, and comparative research continues to enrich our understanding.

Globalization has also advanced. The 2008 financial crisis showed that we belong to a vast interconnected system. Because of its global scope, climate change cannot be addressed with few countries acting alone, and in spite of its global threat solutions have not been forthcoming. International cooperation is also required to stem the spread of infectious diseases as well as fight crime and terrorism. Global governance is required, but it will not be easy in a world marked by major cleavages.

Meanwhile, conflicts among countries persist. In Asia, tensions over disputed borders and islands have taken on renewed significance, and the resulting emphasis on national security has had adverse effects on domestic politics and democracy. Also worrisome are renewed disputes over the borders between Europe and Russia.

Our world is an unpredictable place. There have since been popular revolts against democratically-elected leaders in Thailand, Turkey, South Africa, Ukraine, and Venezuela. In this global context, a broad-ranging set of theoretical and empirical tools are necessary. The World Congress is one such tool, as it fulfills IPSA central goal to promote political science on a global level. We hope you interact with your colleagues from different backgrounds, and we look forward to working together to better understand these challenges.

We owe a debt of gratitude to those who made this World Congress possible. Program Chair Vincent Hoffmann-Martinot and the IPSA program committee did an exemplary job of staging this event. Thanks go to Stéphane Paquin and the entire Local Organizing Committee for their remarkable efforts. IPSA General Secretary Guy Lachapelle also deserves our heartfelt thanks for his continued work at the helm of IPSA. The members of the IPSA Secretariat worked extremely hard to make this event a success: Yee Fun Wong, Roksolana Bobyk, Valerie Beech, Andrea Cestaro, Mathieu St-Laurent, Sarah Veilleux-Poulin and Claude Berlinguette. This event would not have been possible without your commitment.

*Bienvenue à Montréal, au 23<sup>e</sup> Congrès mondial de l'Association internationale de science politique. Cette année, le thème de l'événement est : « Les défis de la gouvernance contemporaine. »*

*Nous vivons à une époque de grands défis, où la contribution des politologues aux débats concernant les questions de gouvernance est primordiale. Avec son Congrès mondial, l'AISP cherche à favoriser une conversation globale faisant avancer nos connaissances en science politique et en d'autres domaines. Nous sommes ravis de vous compter parmi nous pour cet événement.*

*Les défis de la gouvernance se présentent souvent de l'intérieur. Depuis le milieu des années 1970, plusieurs pays sont passés de l'autocratie à la démocratie. Mais, plus récemment, ce mouvement vers davantage de démocratie s'est arrêté, parfois s'est même inversé. La crise financière de 2008 a porté un coup dur à plusieurs pays. Pour certains pays en Europe de l'Est, d'Europe centrale et d'Europe du Sud, les problèmes économiques et politiques sont allés main dans la main.*

*La science politique a permis de comprendre quelles forces agissent en faveur de la démocratie, et quelles institutions consolident les démocraties matures. Mais il importe tout autant de s'interroger sur les forces corrosives sapant la démocratie et qui installent l'autocratie.*

*Dans certaines régions, la démocratie fait face à des défis sérieux. Le printemps arabe a semblé signaler un tournant vers la démocratie dans une région ayant une longue histoire avec le pouvoir autocratique. Toutefois, les étapes en ce sens furent marquées par la lenteur et l'hésitation. Il y a quelques années, dans de nombreux pays d'Afrique sub-saharienne, on annonçait l'avènement d'élections multipartites. Maintenant, on se demande si des élections libres et équitables pourraient apporter une meilleure démocratie. L'Amérique latine est arrivée plus tôt à la démocratie, mais la criminalité et le trafic de stupéfiants constituent toujours de très graves problèmes. L'Asie offre un portrait mixte. Par exemple, le modèle chinois est celui d'une croissance économique rapide couplée à une autocratie forte.*

*La recherche en science politique a permis d'identifier des spécificités propres à différents pays et régions, et la recherche comparative permet d'améliorer notre interprétation. La mondialisation, aussi, a progressé. Notre appartenance à un vaste réseau interconnecté a été explicitée par la crise financière de 2008; le problème du réchauffement climatique, par sa nature planétaire, ne peut raisonnablement être abordé à travers un seul pays, ou même quelques-uns, agissant seuls... Malgré les pronostics les plus inquiétants peu de solutions sont proposées.*

*La coopération internationale est tout aussi nécessaire pour enrayer la propagation de maladies infectieuses que pour combattre le crime et le terrorisme. La gouvernance mondiale est nécessaire, elle ne sera pas aisée, particulièrement dans un monde marqué par d'importants clivages.*

*Pendant ce temps, les conflits internationaux persistent. En Asie, la contestation de frontières et de la propriété d'îles revêt une signification nouvelle et l'intensification de la sécurité nationale qui en résulte a eu des effets négatifs sur la politique intérieure et de la démocratie. Le renouveau des conflits quant aux frontières de l'Europe et de la Russie préoccupe également.*

*Notre monde est imprévisible. En Thaïlande, en Turquie, en Afrique du Sud, en Ukraine et au Venezuela, la population se révolte contre des gouvernants démocratiquement élus. Dans ce contexte global, un vaste ensemble d'outils théoriques et empiriques est nécessaire. Le Congrès mondial représente un tel outil, répondant à l'objectif central de l'AISP de promouvoir la science politique à l'échelle mondiale.*

*Nous espérons que vous et vos collègues provenant de différents horizons pourrez interagir et nous sommes impatients de travailler ensemble à mieux comprendre ces nombreux défis.*

*Toute notre gratitude va à ceux qui ont rendu possible ce Congrès Mondial. Le Président du programme Vincent Hoffmann-Martinot ainsi que le comité de programme de l'AISP, en organisant cet événement, ont accompli un travail exemplaire. This year's event marks the second time the International Political Science Association holds its World Congress in Montreal. In August 1973, Sir George Williams University - now Concordia University - hosted the 9th World Congress of Political Science, which drew a turnout of some 1,044 political scientists. John E. Trent of the University of Ottawa, then president of the local organizing committee, called attention to the fact that universities from Quebec and Canada collaborated closely on the organization of the event, and he thanked Montreal's Loyola College for its financial contribution toward the printing of the World Congress program. The following year, I began my undergraduate studies at the Université de Montréal. In their courses, several of my professors, among them local organizing committee member James Ian Gow, mentioned that meeting the likes of then-IPSA president Stein Rokkan, Karl Deutsch, Johan Galtung, Albert Hirschman and many others had been the high point of the event. The opening session of the 1973 World Congress also saw Montreal Mayor Jean Drapeau welcome the participants.

Some 40 years on, Montreal is set, once again, to host the World Congress of Political Science and inaugurate the event's new biennial cycle. This event furthers consolidates the close ties between the Ville de Montréal and IPSA, particularly since 2001, when the IPSA Secretariat took up residence at Concordia University. From one year to the next, IPSA has enjoyed consistent growth, and this year more than 3,000 political scientists from 80+ countries will present their work and debate the major issues related to contemporary governance. More than ever, citizens are demanding that governments enact policies that are better adapted to the challenges of our new century. Political scientists have a great many solutions to propose, and our hope is that they will have the ear of decision-makers. Over and above our professional activities, IPSA has always sought to be a place where various perspectives can be debated and shared, and where participants can attest to the cultural diversity of our association and benefit from a springboard toward further comparative studies.

Finally, I would like to extend a word of thanks to Concordia University, which has supported us from the outset and given us an exceptional place from which to develop as a professional association and become a true hub for political science worldwide.

**Canada**

Canada is a diverse North American country made out of 10 provinces and 3 territories. Located in the northern part of the continent, it extends from the Atlantic to the Pacific, and is the second largest country in the world. It shares the world's biggest border with the United States, totalling 8,900 kilometers (which includes both land and shared waterways), as well as two maritime boundaries with the autonomous Danish territory of Greenland and the autonomous French overseas islands of Saint Pierre and Miquelon. Canada is a federal state governed as a parliamentary democracy and a constitutional monarchy, with Queen Elizabeth II acting as head of state. Canada has a population of 35 million and two official languages, English and French.

**Montréal**

With a population of about 1.7 million (or over 3.8 million if you include the greater metropolitan area), Montréal is the largest city in the province of Québec and the second most populated city in Canada. With its French roots, British heritage and North American upbringing, Montréal offers Old World flair mixed with New World energy, 17th-century colonial architecture sharing the same skyline with sleek high-rises, plus an eclectic blend of cultural influences from all over the world. From historic Old Montréal to the trendy Plateau to family-friendly HoMa, charming Little Italy and a safe, always happening downtown core, there's lots to explore and lots of ways to get up close and personal with the locals, all within safe walking distance.

**Canadian Currency**

Canadian currency is the Canadian dollar, which is divided into 100 cents. There are 5, 10, 20, 50 and 100 dollar bills and 1 and 2 dollar coins. Smaller coins are 5, 10, and 25 cent pieces. Banking and credit cards are also welcome almost everywhere. Cash in foreign currency is not generally accepted.

**Communications****Internet**

Most hotels offer access to Wi-Fi in their rooms or through their Business Centers. Certain areas of the city, like the Old Port offer free Wi-Fi access. While you are on the Promenade (see map of coverage area), simply tell your device to connect to the network called "Vieux-Port de Montréal". Next, open your Web browser. A connection page will open. Click "Connect" and you're done! You will now be able to surf the Web.

Île Sans Fil, a non-profit organization, provides free internet access in more than 250 public places in the city of Montréal. To view a complete list of libraries, bistros, cafés, parks and other places serviced by Île Sans Fil, please visit <http://www.ilesansfil.org/welcome/>

Most coffee shops and restaurants offer their patrons free internet access. Montréal is also well-provided for with internet cafés and there are several throughout the city.

**International and National Phone Calls**

The country code of Canada is +1 and the local area code for Montréal is 514. To call Montréal from abroad, dial: 00 1 514 followed by the local number. International phone cards with cheap rates can be found at a variety of corner stores in Montréal. Pay phones accept phone cards, credit cards and change.

**Driving**

Québec uses the metric system, so speeds are indicated in kilometres (100 km/h = 62 mph) and gas is sold in litres (3 3/4 litres = 1 US gallon). Rights on reds are strictly prohibited on the island of Montréal. Use a hand-held cell phone that does not have a hands-free function is prohibited while driving. Parking in the city centre is not difficult; there are many of paid parking lots and meter parking. Some parking meters have been replaced by automatic pay stations. Numbered blue and white signs indicate where these parking spaces are available.

**Electricity**

Electrical voltage in Canada is 110-120 volts, 60 Hertz (cycles per second). Plugs have two flat prongs. Multi-voltage appliances (laptops, etc) will require a plug adapter. For appliances of 220-240V, a step-up transformer will be needed in addition to the adapter.

**Exchange**

Exchange facilities are available at Trudeau Airport, most banks and hotels. The exchange rate is roughly \$1.00 USD = \$1.05 CAD.

**Gastronomy**

As the city with the largest number of restaurants per capita in North America, chances are that you are going to find just the region or type of food you crave in Montréal - and it's going to be delicious! Ingenuity is the main ingredient in a unique cuisine that deftly mixes invention with tradition. The result? An inspired blend of local influences, daring world flavours and European heritage.

**Health**

It is strongly recommended that visitors get their own medical insurance program to cover health care expenses during their stay.

**Hotels**

The table below features a list of accommodations available at the time of publication. For budget-conscious delegates, university dormitory rooms are also available for rent during the congress.



**Opening Hours**

Most shops are open Monday to Wednesday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., Thursday to Friday from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. They are usually closed on legal holidays – and on January 2 in the majority of cases – but some establishments (supermarkets, SAQ outlets, etc.) may still be open.

**Personal Safety**

Although Montréal is a safe city for foreigners, we recommend that you use common sense to avoid any unfortunate encounters. Please note that the police emergency number is 911.

**Taxes & Tips**

There are two applicable taxes in Québec: a federal Goods and Services Tax (TPS) of 5 % and a Québec provincial tax (TVQ) of 9.975 %. A 3.5 % accommodation tax is also in effect in Montréal. It is customary to tip restaurant waiters, taxi drivers, hairdressers, are also normally tipped 15%. Bellhops, porters, doormen, etc. generally receive at least \$2 per suitcase or per service rendered. Coffee and food counters often have a tip cup next to the cash register; spare change is always appreciated.

**Transportation**Airport

The Montréal-Trudeau Airport is located just 20 km from downtown. Self-service check-in is available for all flights, and there is now free internet access throughout the terminal. In addition, real-time flight information is provided by text message (SMS).

BIXI

The system is accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week from May to November. This service enables citizens and tourists to borrow a bicycle from a station, travel to their destination and return it to any other station across the network (400 stations and 5,000 Bixis).

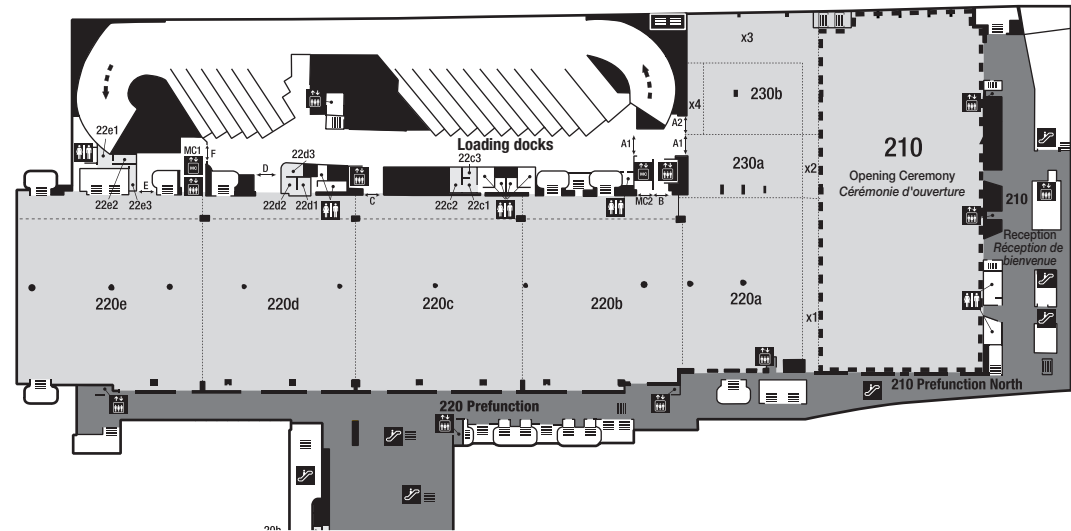

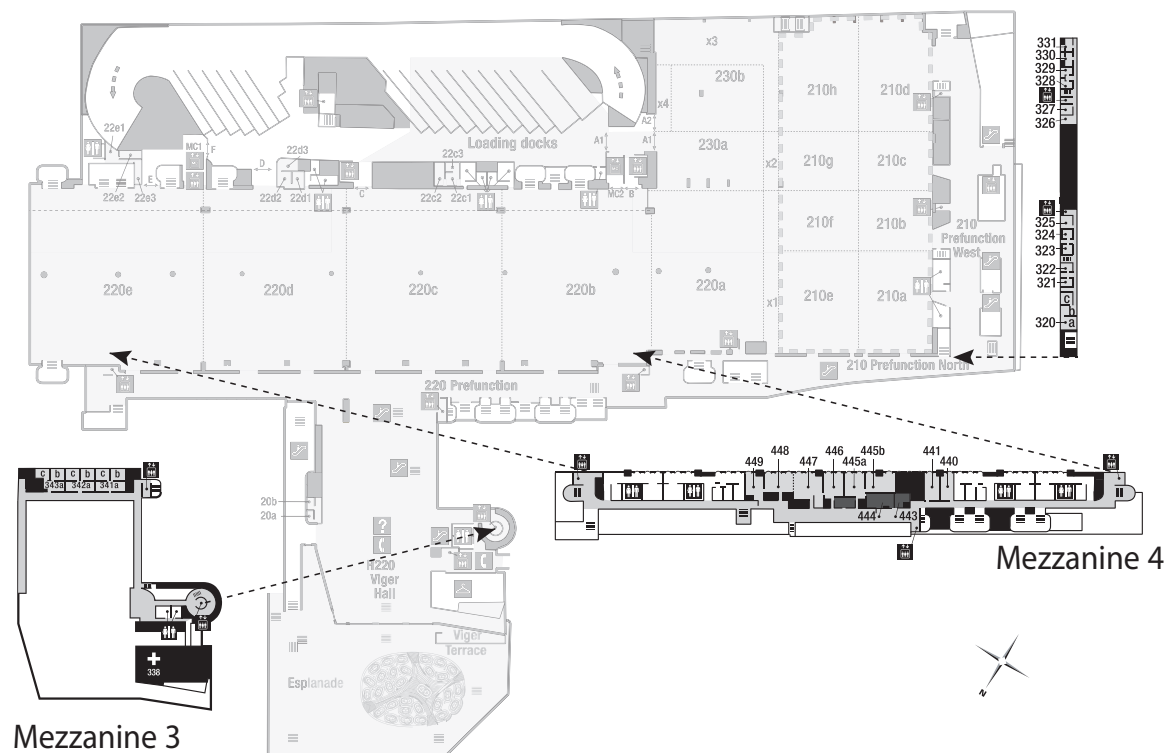

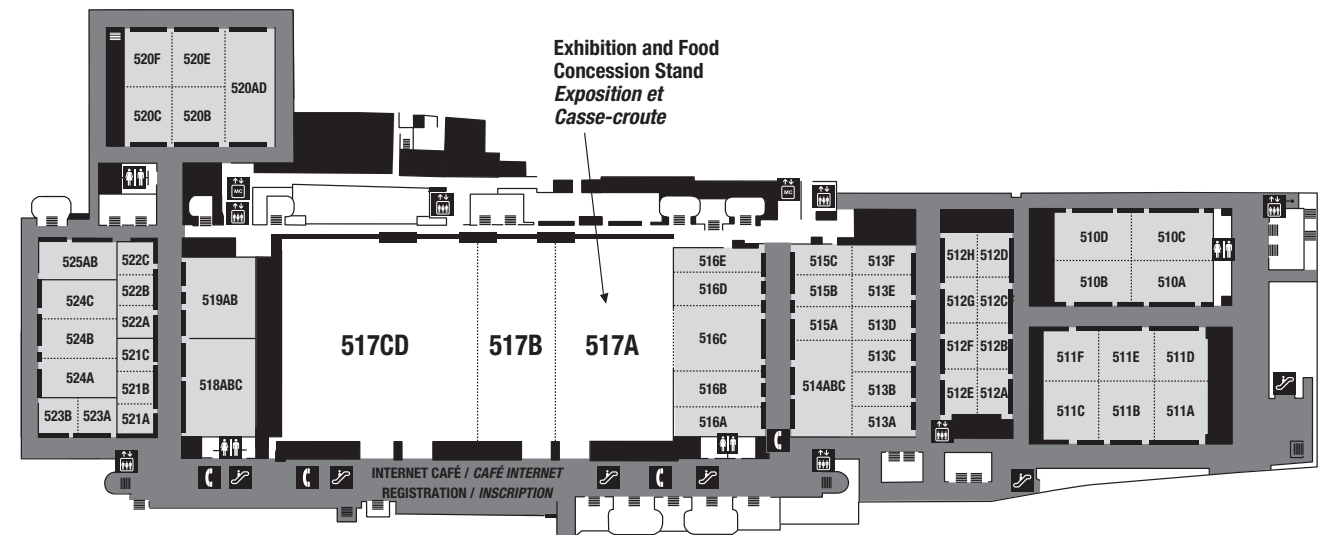

Pippa Norris is a comparative political scientist. She serves as the McGuire Lecturer in Comparative Politics at Harvard's John F. Kennedy School of Government, Laureate Research Fellow and Professor of Government and International Relations at the University of Sydney, and Director of the Electoral Integrity project. Her research compares elections and public opinion, democratic institutions and cultures, gender politics, and political communications in countries worldwide. A well-known public speaker and prolific author, she has also directed Democratic Governance at the UNDP in New York and served as an expert consultant for many other international organizations, including the OSCE, World Bank, UNESCO, NDI, and UN Women. She has published more than forty books including, in 2014, *Why Electoral Integrity Matters* (NY: Cambridge University Press), *Advancing Electoral Integrity*, edited with Richard W. Frank and Ferran Martínez I Coma (NY: Oxford University Press) and *Comparing Democracies*, edited with Lawrence LeDuc and Richard Niemi (4th edition, Sage Publications, UK). *Pippa Norris se spécialise dans la politique comparée. He was secretary of the Research Committee on Comparative Study of Local Government and Politics (RC-05) from 1976 to 1979, member of the IPSA Executive Committee from 1979 to 1985, and program chair of the 13th IPSA World Congress (Paris 1985). He was also secretary of the Norwegian Political Science Association and taught at Oslo University. He passed



away in March 1998.

**Wilma Rule Award / Prix Wilma Rule**

This award was instituted by the Executive Committee on the recommendation of the Committee on Participation and the Committee on Awards. It was designed to encourage research in the area of gender and politics and was launched at the congress in Québec City in 2000. It is given to the best paper on gender and politics. The IPSA Awards Committee has recommended naming the award in tribute to the work of Wilma Rule.

**Wilma Rule (1925-2004)**

Wilma Rule received a B.A. in Political Science and in Journalism in 1949 and an M.A. in Political Science in 1950 from the University of California at Berkeley. Her Ph.D. was granted by the University of Hawaii in 1968. She was awarded a postdoctoral fellowship for the Inter-University Consortium for Political and Social Research at the University of Michigan and did additional postdoctoral work in organizational behavior at Northwestern University. She was an assistant professor at Northern Illinois University from 1969 to 1975. She served as long-time Secretary-Treasurer of the Representation and Electoral Systems Section of the American Political Science Association.

Her study of gender and politics led to a lifetime of research on electoral systems and how they facilitated or hindered the election of women and underrepresented minorities to public office. Wilma Rule was a leading writer and political science researcher whose work resulted in a number of articles and books that challenge conventional notions about the reasons for the lack of political representation by women in the US.

Except for Visiting Professorships at Yale and in the UK, he spent his whole academic life at Queen's where he pioneered studies of elections and political parties, the role of government in the arts, the politics of regulation and challenges to national cohesion. He was the founding editor of The Canadian Journal of Political Science and of The International Political Science Review. "Causal Explanation and Multi-Method Research in the Social Sciences" (Political Methods 26, February 2010).

After a long and often fiercely fought debate over the respective values of quantitative and qualitative methods in the social sciences, multi-method research (MMR) is emerging as a new methodological paradigm. The debate on MMR meets with the ongoing discussion about standards of good causal inference and explanation. It is now widely acknowledged in the philosophy of science and social sciences that one should strive for causal explanations that include propositions of both causal effects and causal processes. Our paper provides a systematic discussion of the potential of MMR to assess and produce robust causal explanations, which is an issue that has received surprising little attention so far. We argue that the salient dimension to be addressed in light of the plea for causal explanations and MMR concerns the distinction between deterministic and probabilistic causality. In the first part of the paper, we detail the implications of determinism and probabilism for the formulation of causal explanations and cross-case and within-case propositions in particular. Based on this framework, we evaluate the potential of MMR to develop and test causal explanations in the second part. We conclude from this discussion that the causal inferences generated through MMR are considerably less certain than the current state of the debate about MMR suggests.

It is presented annually to a scholar who has made exceptional contributions to research in the field through a sustained career. Awardees must have involved themselves significantly within RC27 - Structure and Organization of Government (SOG) - both with respect to research and leadership.
